Reflections

Jn 2:13-25

The Holy Anger of Jesus

The commitment that Jesus has to his relationship with God grounds the fury we see within him in today's text. It is a confronting scene where he aggressively responds by cutting through the unpleasant, worldly and surplus build-up that this sacred space had become; obscuring the very thing it was there to reveal. No wonder Jesus is angry!

Jesus desires and focuses only one thing: receiving and giving the love of God. Anything that participates in and reveals the love of God, Jesus celebrates. Anything that gets in the way and obscures the love of God, Jesus takes to it with a whip.

Fear, false humility and the need to retain control in our lives are just a few reasons why we might avoid focusing on what it truly means to live with God's absolute love for us. It's easier to focus on secondary things (doctrines, behaviours, practises), especially when we don't know how to begin a deeply meaningful relationship with God. A good place to start is recognising that the thing we want and need can only come about by the grace of God.

Throughout Lent, consider abstaining from those peripheral aspects of your faith that keep you from having a truly remarkable, deeply fulfilling and *PROFOUNDLY* loving relationship with God; it may be fear of commitment or disappointment, it may be holding onto a custom that no longer seems relevant, it may be a reluctance to change.


