Reflections: Matthew 28:16-20

God enfleshed in us

The Feast of the Trinity is a day for reflecting on who God is, not for trying to figure out how there can be three persons in one God.

The Church's focus today is on experience, not theology. In intellectual terms, God remains a mystery. For people of faith, God is known not by the mind, but by the heart. That is what spirituality and mysticism are about - exploring our experience of God.

Through our public liturgy, private prayer and contemplation we come to experience - to 'know' and feel in our hearts - that God loves us, accepts us, forgives us and constantly invites us into an ever-deeper experience of love.

When we allow God's heart to speak to ours in love we begin to absorb more of God's life into our own. We are being transformed. Our values and attitudes, our ways of looking at and being in the world start to change. We begin to see with God's eyes and feel with God's heart. We become passionate about the things God is passionate about: speaking truthfully, acting with justice and integrity, looking out for each other and especially for the vulnerable, promoting peace and understanding, ending competition and discrimination, respecting life.

That makes us better people and our lives become a blessing for each other and for the world.

That is what it means to live out of God's great gift to us, the Spirit of Jesus Christ which God has placed in our hearts. God becomes enfleshed in us and we become stewards of God's grace and life. Courtesy of carmelites.org.au

Vinnies Winter Appeal

The St Vincent de Paul Society NSW has launched its annual Vinnies Winter Appeal highlighting the changing face of disadvantage and poverty in Australia that now includes more people in jobs.

The combined housing and cost of living crises means that many people, who in previous years would have been able to sustain themselves, are now having to turn to charity to keep a roof over their heads, put food on the table or pay for bills. Nearly one million people in NSW are living in poverty, around 13% of the population. Of these, more than one-quarter have a job. Of the 35,000 people who were experiencing homelessness in NSW at the last Census, around 40% were employed in either part-time or full-time jobs.

Building update

Thank you to all those who approached us after last week's request for professional opinions regarding the upgrading of our poor old sad sound system. We really appreciate your reaching out to us.

This week, we have been following up on your suggestions and were visited by Clare Communications. As you can imagine, sound systems for churches are quite specialised because they amplify sound in unique building structures. They are not like domestic sound systems, for example, where the space is smaller and sound is reverberated or absorbed at close proximity. Donal from Clare Communications installed our current system 25 years ago and we'll be eager to see his quote.

Last year, we received a very competitive quote from The PA People (again, specialists in their field) so it'll be interesting to see how they compare.

We would still like to hear from any parishioner who can give us their *PROFESSIONAL* opinion regarding this project or how we upgrade/improve our current sound system. If you're interested, please phone or email the parish office asap.

Incident Reporting

As part of our commitment to keep parishioners, visitors, contractors and staff safe and compliant, we have created an Incident Report form that will be kept in the Parish Centre. If you witness an incident where someone is hurt or could potentially be hurt, please fill out this form and return to the Parish Office. You can be as brief as you like.

The rationale for this form is so that we have a good understanding of which areas of concern we need to keep an eye on. So, for example, if there are several incidents of people slipping on the tiles on the parish centre steps, then it's an issue we need to address quickly. It may seem insignificant at the time, and maybe no one was hurt (which is great!), but if these little incidents are not reported, then we can't mend it.

Ideally, the reporting would include your name and contact number but, if you would prefer to remain anonymous, that's ok. This is not an opportunity to raise general grievances, but a serious attempt at addressing any patterns of risk in our parish.

Attending Mass with mobility issues

If you are attending Mass and feel you may have mobility issues, please ask an Altar Server or minister to provide you with a chair that has armrests and to receive Communion from your seat.

There are two chairs with armrests in the Chapel of Reconciliation as well as the Parish Centre that could easily be moved to accommodate you better.

For those without mobility issues, please keep an eye out for those who may need a little assistance, and keep these armchairs for those who need them.
