Reflections:

Mk 4:26-34

From little things

It is wonderful to see Jesus, again and again, looking at life around him, for things and images that might help the people to detect and to experience the presence of the Kingdom. In today's Gospel, again, he tells two short stories about things that happen every day in our lives:

The story of the seed that grows all on its own: The farmer who plants the seed knows the process: first the seed, then the green shoot, the leaf, the ear and the grain. The farmer knows how to wait and will not cut the stalk before it is time, but he does not know from where the power comes for the soil, the rain, the sun and the seed to make a seed turn into fruit. That's what the Kingdom of God is like. It's a process. There are stages and points of growth. It takes time and happens in time. The fruit comes at the right time but no one can explain its mysterious power. No one is its master! Only God!

The story of the tiny mustard seed that turns into something very big: The mustard seed is small, but it grows, to the point where the birds can make their nests in its branches. That's what the Kingdom is like. It begins as something very small; it grows and spreads its branches. The parable does not say who the birds are. The answer to that question will come later in the Gospel. The text suggests that it refers to the pagans who will not be able to get into the community and be sharers in the Kingdom.

Jesus explained the parable to his disciples who wanted to know what the parable means. They do not understand it. Jesus is astonished by their failure to understand and at that point responds in a way that is difficult and mysterious. He says to his disciples, "To you has been given the secret of the kingdom of God, but for those outside, everything comes in parables; in order that 'they may indeed look, but not perceive, and may indeed listen, but not understand; so that they may not turn again and be forgiven.'" This makes the people wonder, What use is the parable then? Is it to make things clear or to hide them?

The parable reveals and hides at the same time! It reveals, to those who have become attuned, who accept Jesus, the Servant Messiah. It hides from those who insist on seeing him as Messiah, mighty King. These see the images of the parable but they do not grasp their meaning.

Parish Initiatives (from *Think Tank*)

Thank you to everyone who attended the planning session on a chilly Wednesday morning.

The purpose of the meeting was to begin planning some of the suggestions put forward in the *Think Tank* session with the focus on what we *CAN* do, and these are some of the results:

<u>Children's Liturgy of the Word:</u> Two people have volunteered to coordinate this ministry. For now, they will discern how they would like to operate, and will also begin preparing their resources.

Acolytes and Altar Servers ministry: Fr Alby will begin coordinating these ministries, offering training and formation. Youth: Fr Alby will also invite members of the Youth Choir to attend a listening session with the intention of offering to assist young people of our parish with catechesis, retreats, etc.

Suggestion Box: Parishioners are invited to contribute their questions, enquiries and suggestions into the Suggestion Box in the Parish Centre which will be monitored regularly. Naturally, any contribution that does not align with the Spirit of the parish community will not be addressed.

Prayer Groups: A recurring theme from the *Think Tank* session was for prayer groups. A parishioner has volunteered to begin forming prayer groups; providing those who are interested with the opportunities to join others in intentional prayer.

OLMC Feast Day luncheon: We are proud to recognise and celebrate the uniquely multicultural aspects of our parish and a couple of very brave parishioners will be organising our annual Feast Day luncheon with an invitation to celebrate our backgrounds.

Retreats: Another recurring theme from the *Think Tank* was the concept of retreats. All ages and backgrounds repeatedly requested more scripture, more prayer, more catechesis, more food for our hearts and souls! Volunteers will soon begin planning for retreats of all different themes, ages and timeframes.

Want more? See below:

<u>Pick up a Parishioner:</u> From time-to-time we get a request for someone to drive them to Mass. The parishioner may be elderly or too sick to drive themselves. If you can drive a parishioner to Mass on Sundays, would you please contact the parish office and, if someone close to your address needs a lift, we can contact you.

<u>Communion to the Sick:</u> Are you unable to attend Mass but would like to receive Communion? Or maybe you would like to offer Communion to a sick or elderly parishioner?

If so, please contact the parish office and let us know of your availability. We can arrange for you offer or receive Communion on a temporary or regular basis.

Youth Mass: Did you know that on the first Sunday of the month our young parishioners organise the 10am Mass? The Youth Choir play their instruments and lead the congregation

in song. If you'd like to get involved, please let Moira know after Mass, or email the parish office for more details.

Young children at Mass: Every parishioner has the right to exist in our church, even our youngest parishioners. It's the nature of children to be active and restless so we request that parishioners please understand how difficult it is for babies, toddlers and pre-schoolers to sit still and listen. And, too often, young parents avoid coming to Mass for fear of being judged or reproached if their child/ren act like children.

If you would like to help, maybe you can offer young parents your patience or even a smile, encourage them to persevere with this period in their lives and let them know that all their family are welcome to attend Mass just as they are.

<u>Bible Study:</u> Are you interested in starting a Bible Study? If so, please contact the parish office and let us know how we can support you with this.

<u>Devotionals:</u> Are you called to a particular devotion? Maybe you would like to pray a novena with others, or dedicate an evening to the Stations of the Cross? We currently observe the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament on Saturday mornings and have a regular Rosary group on Monday and Saturday mornings but, if you feel you would like to participate in any other devotional, please email the parish office with your suggestion.

All volunteers in the Diocese of Parramatta must complete mandatory <u>Safeguarding modules</u>.
Furthermore, if you work directly with children (18 years and younger) you must acquire a current <u>Working With Children Check</u>.

All parishioners are invited to read <u>Our Common Mission</u> as well as <u>Integrity in Our Common Mission</u> which is the National Code of Conduct for all in Catholic Ministry along with the Diocesan <u>Code of Conduct</u>. All these documents are readily available online or we can print them for you on request.

If you are reluctant to volunteer because of the mandatory requirements, please consider what you look like to a child; children don't see you as a Warden or a Reader, an Altar Server or a Communion Minister, they see you as a church Leader and therefore someone they can trust.
