## **Reflections:**

Mk 4:35-41

## From little things

A beautiful painting hung on a well-lit wall seems even more beautiful thanks to the colours of the wall that underscores the beauty. The same is true of the painting of the calmed storm. The wall of the context makes it more beautiful.

Mark has just narrated two parables that bring out the mystery of the Kingdom present in the things of life. Now he begins to talk of the mystery of the Kingdom as present in the power exercised by Jesus for his disciples, for people and, above all, for the excluded and marginalized.

Let us examine the sequence: Mark begins by presenting a Jesus who overcomes the sea, the symbol of chaos. In Jesus there is the power of a creator! Immediately after that he shows a Jesus who overcomes and drives out evil spirits. In him there is a liberating power! Finally, he describes at length the way Jesus overcomes impurity and death. In him there is the power of life! In Jesus there is a creating power that liberates, purifies, and communicates life to those who approach him!

Mark is writing for the persecuted communities of the 70's who feel like a small boat lost on the sea of life, with little hope of being able to reach the desired harbour of peace. Jesus seems to be asleep in their boat, because they do not feel the divine power to save them from persecution. In that desperate situation, Mark brings together various passages that underline the power with which Jesus is present in the communities. It is the victorious Jesus! They need not fear.

## **Safeguarding**

Last week, we posted all the wonderful initiatives that parishioners have volunteered to facilitate or would like to see implemented. We posted SO MANY ideas that it may take a few weeks for parishioners to pray for guidance.

If you feel that the Spirit is calling you to participate in the life of the parish in a practical way, we urge you to get in touch with a facilitator or the parish office to see how you can engage further with the community and deepen your faith more fully.

However, ALL volunteers in the Diocese of Parramatta <u>must</u> complete mandatory <u>Safeguarding modules</u>.

Furthermore, if you work directly with children (18 years and younger) you must also acquire a current Working With Children Check.

All parishioners are invited to read <u>Our Common Mission</u> as well as <u>Integrity in Our Common Mission</u> which is the National Code of Conduct for all in Catholic Ministry along with the Diocesan <u>Code of Conduct</u>. All these documents are readily available online or we can print them for you on request.

If you are reluctant to volunteer because of the mandatory requirements, please consider what you look like to a child; children don't see you as a Warden or a Reader, an Altar Server or a Communion Minister, they see you as a church Leader and therefore someone they can trust. Keeping children safe and knowing the correct procedure in assisting a child at risk is of PARAMOUNT importance to this parish. When considered this way, Safeguarding Training is not so much about being inconvenienced, but about our social, ethical and moral duty to keep children and vulnerable people safe.

Safeguarding is EVERYONE'S responsibility.

## **Parish Groups and Ministries**

There are so many practical ways to love Jesus through our community, including the Children's Liturgy of the Word, Acolyte and/or Altar Server Ministries, Youth Choir, etc. And for spiritual nourishment, parishioners are forming prayer groups and planning retreats.

### This is your sign to get involved

If you feel called to become involved in these initiatives, or if you have a great idea that you'd like to work towards, please speak with Frs Janu or Alby after Mass, email the parish office.

<u>Pick up a Parishioner:</u> If you can drive an elderly parishioner to Mass on Sundays, would you please contact the parish office and, if someone close to your address needs a lift, we can contact you.

<u>Communion to the Sick:</u> Are you unable to attend Mass but would like to receive Communion? Or maybe you would like to offer Communion to a sick or elderly parishioner?

If so, please contact the parish office and let us know of your availability. We can arrange for you offer or receive Communion on a temporary or regular basis.

**Young children at Mass:** Every parishioner has the right to exist in our church, even our youngest parishioners. It's the nature of children to be active and restless so we request that parishioners please understand how difficult it is for babies, toddlers and pre-schoolers to sit still and listen.

If you would like to help, maybe you can offer young parents your patience or even a smile, encourage them to persevere with this period in their lives and let them know that all their family are welcome to attend Mass just as they are.

**<u>Bible Study:</u>** Are you interested in starting a Bible Study? If so, please contact the parish office and let us know how we can support you with this.

**Devotionals:** Are you called to a particular devotion? Maybe you would like to pray a novena with others, or dedicate an evening to the Stations of the Cross? We currently observe the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament on Saturday mornings and have a regular Rosary group on Monday and Saturday mornings but, if you feel you would like to participate in any other devotional, please email the parish office with your suggestion.
