

Reflection:

Jn 6:1-15

Nothing will be wasted

It's not a fair comparison, I grant you: but Elisha fed a hundred people with twenty loaves, and Jesus fed 5,000 with five loaves. If you do the math, it explains why people were even more anxious to follow Jesus. Plus, there are the inexplicable twelve baskets left over at the end of the meal that Jesus orchestrated. No wonder they wanted to carry him off and make him king.

But Jesus didn't come to regulate the economy of Israel or to provide welfare-to-work programs. He didn't come to set up a medical clinic or to treat mental illness. Though Jesus does feed some of the hungry and heal some of the sick, by no means did he put an end to suffering in his time or for all time. He left that challenge up to his followers. Jesus simply presents himself as the source of divine abundance and invites us to come to the table and eat. This table's been serving meals for two thousand years, billions have been fed, and there's no end in sight to the feast.

Ponder: What kind of hunger do you bring to the Eucharist? How have you been fed? Reflect on the way a good meal satisfies; food, drink, atmosphere, conversation, company. Maybe even candles and flowers. Compare that meal with the Eucharistic meal we share. Celebrate a holy communion each time you share a meal. From GPBS eNews

Parish Finances

Dear Parishioners

We are pleased to present the financial report for the Year Ended 30 June 2024. The Parish received revenue of \$207,362 but incurred expenses of \$239,143 resulting in a deficiency of \$31,781 for the 12 months period.

Planned Giving for the year amounted to \$180,267. This represented an increase of \$9,328 over the previous 12 months which were impacted by church closure for a period of time due to Covid. **Other Revenue** amounted to \$27,095 which was \$20,026 below that received in the previous 12 months. Revenue for the year included the profit of \$6,785 from the Getting-to-Know-You Dinner held in February and \$3,481 being the proceeds from the Christmas Raffle. Donations accounted for \$11,205. This was \$19,995 less than that received in the previous 12 months.

Total Expenses for the year at \$239,143 were \$54,872 in excess of that for 2022- 2023.

Wages and Administration were \$106,896 (\$102,288 2022-23), Insurance \$39,925 (\$30,220 for 2022-23),

Interest on Loan \$16,739 (\$17,159 2022-23),

maintenance \$27,232 (\$14,333 2022-23),

The Catholic Foundation Fund shortfall \$25,370 (Nil 2022-23) and other expenses \$22,981 (\$20,271 2022-23).

Major repairs were carried out to the timber barge capping on both North and South sides of the church and 11 glass panels were replaced at the front of the church at a cost of \$17,400.

The Parish is still servicing a loan which was raised to fund the renovations undertaken only a few years ago. The balance of the loan stood at \$340,784 as at the end of the financial year.

The Future

The operating costs for running the church continue to escalate (no different to household budgets) putting pressure on Parish finances. Insurance costs have risen well above CPI with the closure of the Catholic Church Insurance in February 2024.

Two vehicles need to be replaced in the near future, the audio system needs to be urgently updated and there are other urgent maintenance issues that need to be addressed.
