Jn 6:51-58

Dinner at Wisdom's table

Do a quick calculation of how many times you've received communion. If you're a cradle Catholic, and have been taking communion since the age of seven, that is, technically speaking, a LOT of communion. The numbers don't really matter, of course, but the habitual reception of communion does. What do we GET, exactly, when we get Eucharist?

The Church teaches that the bread and wine are Christ's Body and Blood. *Transubstantiation* is the million-dollar word for the event, but it's mostly helpful for theologians. Long before the invention of that word, table fellowship was shared among Christians. They understood that eating and drinking in memory of Jesus made them bearers of his life. They knew that sharing his supper also meant they shared his saving mission in the world. They believed that taking part in this meal was a commitment, a covenant in flesh and blood. This was serious business. To claim Jesus in this way meant that they might die for him.

Most of us in the receiving line at communion time will not be asked to die for Christ. But every one of us *IS* being asked to live for Christ. Are we in the right line, or aren't we?

From the Carmelites

When we think of You, Lord, we do not recall events that took place and were fulfilled long ago, but we come into contact with Your reality ever present and alive. We see Your constant passage among us. You intervene in our life to restore our likeness to You, so that we may not be disfigured by the stones of the law, but may find our fullest expression in Your face as Father, revealed in the face of a man, Jesus, the promise of fidelity and love even unto death. It is not necessary at all to go out of ordinary existence to meet You because the care You take of Your creatures unfolds over our human affairs like a scroll in the proximity of an experience. You, Creator of heaven and earth, indeed do hide in the folds of history and, even though at first obscurely and implicitly, You allow us to meet You in Your transcendence, which is never absent from ordinary events. When our reflection on life brings us to an acknowledgment of Your liberating presence, this meeting can only be celebrated, sung, expressed by sacred symbols, relived festively in great joy. Thus we do not come to You alone, but as a people of the covenant. The wonder of Your presence is always purely gratuitous: in the members of the Church, where two or three are gathered in the name of Jesus in the pages of Sacred Scripture, in evangelical preaching, in the poor and suffering in the sacramental actions of ordained ministers. But it is in the Eucharistic sacrifice that Your presence becomes real; in the Body and Blood there is the whole of the humanity and divinity of the risen Lord, present substantially.

Parish Finances

New Tap & Go Devices

Tap & Go machines have been a very popular form of donation for hundreds of parishes around Australia, including here at OLMC, Wentworthville. They offer the convenience of donating without carrying cash, and your donation is safely processed immediately.

The Tap & Go devices currently rely on a 3G network and, while the planned 3G network outage has been extended for October, our Tap & Go devices will be made redundant in September this year. As we cannot upgrade the Tap & Go units to 4G, we decided to change the units to a model that most consumers would be familiar with.

With the new devices, parishioners and visitors will now be able to select the amount they would like to donate (\$5, \$10, \$20 or another amount) and then 'tap' their card or device to process the payment.

Gennie, our Parish Finance Manager, will be available after the 6pm (Vigil) Mass and the 8am Mass this Sunday to assist parishioners with transitioning from old to new Tap & Go machines.

With Gennie at these two Masses, it will be a great opportunity to learn how to use the new devices, and it's also a chance for us to iron-out any issues with the new devices before permanently transitioning to them.

Just like our old devices, the new devices will not provide a receipt.


