# **Reflection** Lk 21:25-28, 34-36

#### Emmanuel, God with us loves us.

As we look forward to the Christmas season, we are busy buying gifts and decorations, cooking, and making plans for holidays. Today's gospel, though, warns of a catastrophe at Jesus's second coming, and our daily news indeed keeps us afraid that our world will soon end. The core message of all three readings, however, is God's love.

When buying our first home, Michelle and I asked the Lord for a sign about which property to choose. We were unsure if asking for a sign was the right approach, but we were faithful that the Lord would provide. Then, when we moved in, a well-intentioned friend advised us on how to prosper; our home was filled with religious icons and we were advised to remove the picture of the Holy Face because it's bad luck, to remove the crucifix as it signifies suffering. Our friend was disappointed that our house was not facing the north and aligned with the stars.

What signs are we struggling with?

In today's Gospel, Jesus asks us to be aware of signs. For Christians, a sign of crisis is not a time to feel hopeless. The Lord wants us to be aware of His presence and find strength in His promises, commands and teachings.

The promise made in today's first reading is fulfilled in John 3:16: "For God so loved the world, that He gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life.

In the second reading, St Paul reminds us that God loves us, and so we should love God in return. He prays that the Lord helps us grow in love with each other, that God makes our hearts strong so we can be good and holy while we prepare ourselves in this time of Advent for the second coming of Christ.

#### The fullness of life

The weeks leading up to Christmas and school holidays are often a particularly busy time. Sometimes, the urgency to 'get things done' means that what we do isn't always our best. It may be driven less by quality and more by ticking boxes. Our encounters with others can sometimes be like that as well -driven less by genuine love and more by expediency. Today's Gospel reminds us that there is no room for either carelessness or complacency.

Some of us even thrive on being busy. Being busy makes it easy to not have time for reflection, to lose sight of when our actions lack the virtue, honesty and integrity Christ himself modelled. We can neglect our relationship with God and seek comfort in other vices - material possessions, social media, power and control, gambling, alcohol, drugs - perhaps to the point of harm. We tune out to Christ calling to us in the cry of the poor, the suffering, the neglected and the abused.

The Season of Advent opens with the call to pray constantly. By stepping back from our busy lives and making time for prayer, we can draw closer to God, genuinely reflect on our lives and act with love. Advent calls us to choose the way that leads to freedom and fullness of life. It calls us to choose the way that we know is not just a moral code but a person: God, whose coming into the world in Christ we will celebrate with joy at Christmas time.

**To Ponder:** Am I confident that I am living in the way that leads to fullness of life?

The Church's *Book of Blessings* provides a prayer for you to bless your wreath at home. Visit <u>olmcwentyliturgy.org/wreath</u> for an outline of this short ritual that you can download or use on a device such as a phone or tablet, as well as supporting material for each week.

Lighting the candles of the wreath can be a part of a family's prayer before an evening meal during Advent. When lighting the first candle this week, pray the Collect Prayer for today's Mass, which is provided below:

Grant your faithful, we pray, almighty God, the resolve to run forth to meet your Christ with righteous deeds at his coming, so that, gathered at his right hand, they may be worthy to possess the heavenly Kingdom. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

### **Bishop's Christmas Appeal 2024**

The fourth and final Bishop's Appeal for this year will be held this weekend.

One of our Tap&Go devices in the Parish Centre has been specifically assigned to accept donations for this appeal only. In other words, all monies collected from this specific Tap&Go device over the course of this weekend will go directly to support the Bishop's Christmas Appeal. Donations over \$2 are tax deductible and you can receive a printed receipt from that Tap&Go device on that day.

The Bishop's Christmas Appeal will raise funds to support Catholic Care Western Sydney and the Blue Mountains' nationally accredited Houses to Homes program.

This program supports pregnant women and young mothers aged between 16 and 25, who are homeless or at serious risk of homelessness. The program provides transitional housing for up to two years to help them get back on their feet, as well as essential support services including counselling, parenting education, living skills support, employment and training support, and so much more. Many of these women and their

children have experienced significant trauma, including domestic and/or family violence, and our parish support would help reshape the lives of these local, vulnerable young families.

#### Jubilee Year of 2025: Pilgrims of Hope

On Sunday 29 December 2024, Pope Francis will open the Holy Door of the Basilica of St Peter in the Vatican and inaugurate the Jubilee Year of 2025, with the theme being Pilgrims of Hope.

the year 2000, celebrated the Great Jubilee; the 2000th anniversary of the



Saviour of humanity; Jesus Christ. Now, 25 years later - and in accordance with an ancient tradition - the Christian community comes together to experience 'a moment of genuine, personal encounter with the Lord Jesus, the "door" (Jn 10:7) of our salvation.'

In his Bull, Pope Francis outlines the many ways we can see signs of hope; the desire for peace, enthusiasm and support for parenthood, dignity for prisoners, for the sick, for the young, for migrants, refugees and the displaced, for the elderly, and the poor.

The coming Jubilee Year also coincides with the 1700th anniversary of the first Ecumenical Council which took place in Nicaea where we derived our Creed from all those years ago.
