

Reflections for this week's readings

First Reading: Joshua 5: 9-12 **Responsorial Psalm:** Psalm 33: 2-7

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 5: 17-21 Gospel: Luke 15: 1-3, 11-32

Return to the loving Father

How blessed are we to witness this Great Jubilee year 2025, I believe it's a pure grace from our Lord and an open invitation to every one of us to come in "Pilgrims of Hope," which means coming closer to our living God, Forgiving God through Good Confessions and forgiving those who hate us, do harm to us and LET GO the spirit of grudge, hatred, envy and jealously, to instead be filled with Love, Compassion, Hope & Grace.

I want to share our journey this year in preparation for this "Pilgrims of Hope. "As a small prayer group, we organized a day retreat at the Shrine of Our Lady of Mercy (Berrima) led by our own Fr. Alby. Hearing good confession, celebrating Holy Mass and holy adoration blessings, praising and worshipping God, and in silence and following by the Stations of the Cross, we felt closer to Jesus through this wonderful preparation in this Jubilee Year, LENT with full of Grace.

In the Parable of the Prodigal Son, the elder son's response to his father reveals a lack of emotional connection and understanding. The father tells him, "Son, you are with me always, and all that is mine is yours" yet the elder son feels neglected and poor, failing to grasp the richness of his position within the family. Highlighting his detachment and lack of familial affection, this emotional and spiritual disconnect transforms the family dynamic into a legalistic


arrangement. This issue can occur in religious communities where members are bound by rules but lack genuine emotional and spiritual connections and environments. Whether in families or religious settings, these can become lifeless and impersonal, neither of which fulfill the commandments of love. True obedience aligns our desires with God's will, transcending any sense of entitlement.

Like the younger son, let us return to our True Living Lord in the Most Holy Eucharist - he is waiting with his wide-open arms to welcome us, as the Father welcomed his lost son in today's Gospel.
