Reflections for this week's readings

Luke 22:42


We are all very familiar with the story we hear today, it is after all part of the great celebration of Easter and basic to our faith. There are so many elements to think about in this part of the story — love, forgiveness, sacrifice and betrayal. But what struck me this time as I read the Gospel passage and St Paul's letter, was Jesus' acceptance of his human fate.

In today's Gospel we see Jesus' triumphant and joyous entry into Jerusalem, acclaimed by the people as He passes by. We follow His journey through a mostly peaceful and wonderful meal we know as the Last Supper, filled with laughter and friendship. And then, the happiness ends with the betrayal by Judas, the time on the Mount of Olives, arrest, trial and crucifixion. The agony in the garden is a very special time for Jesus. We know He is fully aware of what is to happen to His human self. Does He ask himself "why me?", "how can I avoid the pain and suffering which is to come?" as many of us would? We don't know. What we do know, is, that he prays. He prays for His friends that they be spared from being tested. And He prays in anguish and grief for Himself; "Father, if you are willing, take this cup from me. Nevertheless, let your will be done, not mine." Jesus prays and in prayer, He finds strength and acceptance of what is to come. God, His father, comes to help Him.

As we live our ordinary everyday lives, most of us experience many moments of joy and contentment, and these times are easy to accept. But when we are called upon to face life's difficulties — diagnosis of a severe illness, death of a loved one, loss of a job or our home —acceptance is often difficult to find. The Gospel also tells us that Peter was tested and failed at this time, but he accepted what he had done, was remorseful and found forgiveness. Jesus teaches us that when we pray, God comes to our aid, and we too can find strength to face the future, acceptance of the future, love and forgiveness.


