Reflections for this week's readings

First Reading: Acts 5: 12-16

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 117: 2-4, 22-27 **Second Reading:** Revelations 1: 9-13, 17-19:1

Gospel: John 20: 19-31

Jesus Appears to His Disciples

The Gospel of the 2nd Sunday of Easter, often referred to as Divine Mercy Sunday, is a significant moment in the liturgical calendar. It celebrates the profound mercy and love of Jesus Christ as revealed through His resurrection and the subsequent appearances to His disciples. This Sunday serves as a powerful reminder of the divine mercy extended to all humanity and encourages us to embrace and reflect this mercy in our lives.

The Gospel reading for the 2nd Sunday of Easter is taken from John 20:19-31. This passage recounts two post-resurrection appearances of Jesus to His disciples. The first appearance occurs on the evening of the first day of the week, when Jesus finds His disciples gathered behind closed doors out of fear. Jesus greets them with the words, "Peace be with you" and shows them His hands and His side, thus confirming His identity as the risen Lord. He breathes on them and says, "Receive the Holy Spirit" thereby commissioning them for their future mission.

The second appearance takes place a week later, when Thomas, who was absent during the first visitation, joins the group. Thomas expresses his doubts about Jesus' resurrection and declares that he would only believe if he could see and touch the wounds of Jesus. In response, Jesus appears once more and invites Thomas to do precisely that. Overwhelmed, Thomas exclaims, "My Lord and my God!"

Jesus then utters the famous words, "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed".

The phrase "Doubting Thomas" originates from this Gospel. While Thomas' skepticism is a relatable aspect of human nature, living perpetually as a doubting Thomas can hinder spiritual growth and personal development. To avoid falling into this pattern, we must nurture faith, cultivate trust, and embrace the teachings of Jesus.

Life is full of uncertainties, and it is natural to experience doubt. Instead of resisting uncertainty, embrace it as an opportunity to strengthen our trust in God. Remember that faith is often forged in the crucible of uncertainty, and it is during these times that we can grow closer to God.

Extend compassion to yourself and others. Recognise that doubt is a natural part of the human experience and offer support to those who are struggling. By fostering an environment of understanding and love, we can help others overcome their doubts and strengthen their faith.

Living like a Doubting Thomas can inhibit spiritual growth and prevent us from experiencing the fullness of God's blessings. By nurturing faith, cultivating trust, embracing Jesus' teachings, seeking community support, and reflecting on our journey, we can overcome doubt and live a life grounded in faith and trust. Remember that faith is a journey, and each step we take brings us closer to God and His divine plan for our lives.

East Timor Mothers' Day Cards


East Timor committee will be selling their annual Mothers' Day cards this weekend for \$5.00 each.

Financial Report for the Nine Months Ended 31 March 2025

The Parish is happy to report a surplus of \$4,362 over the nine months period 1 July 2024 to 31 March 2025. This

surplus was achieved from revenue of \$183,454 against expenses of \$179,092.

The revenue includes planned giving of \$133,283, a NSW Government grant of \$16,663, profit from the recently held Dinner Dance, donations and the other miscellaneous revenue.

Expenses include wages and related costs of \$59,667, interest on the loan \$12,360, the audio system \$31,088, insurance \$32,779, repairs and maintenance \$10,807 and other expenses including motor vehicle running.

The first stage of the audio system is now complete, and we thank Clare Communications for its installation. The insurance costs are a major cost to the Parish and, as with household insurances, the premiums keep going up from year to year. We are blessed, as our maintenance costs are kept to a minimum as most of the work is undertaken by generous and loyal parishioners/volunteers. We are very appreciative for this. We sincerely thank Pat Nolan for undertaking the repairs to the ceiling in the Narthex at no cost to the Parish.

The Parish is in the process of establishing a Fundraising Committee which will report directly to the Finance Committee. They will be responsible for identifying the major needs of the Parish and raise funds to enable their funding and realisation.

We would like to thank all parishioners for their continued financial support as without it, the Parish will not be able to provide the spiritual services it currently does.

The Diocese of Parramatta mourns the death of Pope Francis

As many of you will have heard, the Holy Father, Pope Francis, died earlier today, aged 88.

Please read our article on <u>Catholic Outlook</u> - an excerpt is below:

Francis's Petrine ministry (2013 to 2025) was entirely devoted to his implementing and living out the vision of the Second Vatican Council, applied to our troubled times.

And in our increasingly violent and ethically challenged world, Francis's prophetic voice will be especially acutely missed. Very few leaders today possess his credibility, authenticity and willingness to oppose violence and war and to defend the environment so passionately.

Bishop Vincent Long OFM Conv, the Bishop of Parramatta, said that while this Jubilee year of Hope would eventually end, Pope Francis would always be remembered for keeping the flame of hope, and the message of God's love, alive in a world that needs both more now than ever.

"He showed the rest of us how to find God's love, and how to show God's love," Bishop Vincent said.

"While today is a day of profound grief and sadness for us here in Parramatta and indeed right around the world, it is also a day to give thanks for the life of a man who gave so much to so many.

"He was an example to the rest of us that the source of all wisdom and sustenance is to be found in the Holy Spirit. And by spreading that message to as many parts of the globe as possible, he is the true embodiment of hope."

Let us pray. Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him. May his soul and all the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.
