

The Ascension of the Lord, Yr C (1)



Reflections for this week's readings

First Reading: Acts 1: 1-11

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 46: 2-3, 6-9

Second Reading: Ephesians 1: 17-23

Gospel: Luke 24: 46-53

While blessing them, he was taken to heaven.

What is in your mind and heart when you come to the feast of the Ascension of the Lord? You might say Jesus' Ascension is a mystery. But the fact is that he is bodily taken to heaven, as it shows us from these three readings. It says "why are you standing here looking into the sky? Jesus has been taken into heaven" (Acts 1:11), 'after he is raised and to make him sit at his right hand in heaven' (cf Eph 1:20), and in the gospel, "while blessing them, he was taken to heaven" (Lk 24:51).

The point is that Jesus was taken into heaven to sit at the right hand of the Father. If we see it from the letter to Hebrews (the option of the second reading) gives a clear description about heaven. It says on the day of Ascension, Jesus also enters the heavenly Temple (the heavenly sanctuary not made with hands) to offer the sacrifice of himself to the Father for all eternity, once for all time. It means the sacrificial offering of Jesus is not only on the Calvary, where he pours out his blood and his life on the Cross, but moreover, he admires us by his bodily resurrected from the dead and then his ascension into heaven.

This celebration obviously strengthens our faith and belief in Him. He bodily resurrected as his disciples gave witness to him on several occasions. It manifests that Jesus takes his body, which is now crucified and risen, and he brings that human nature, that human body, that glorified body into heavenly sanctuary where he offers himself as a sacrifice to the Father, not in time, but in eternity, not on earth, but in heaven.

So, the Ascension of the Lord is essential to us, because it signifies that Our Lord Jesus Christ has fulfilled his mission on earth. He fulfilled the feast of Passover where he offered himself as the sacrificial Lamb for our sins, and in his Ascension, Jesus fulfills the Day of Atonement, where the sins are forgiven forever, and now he sits on the right hand of the Father in heaven as the high priest who sanctifies us through the power of the Holy Spirit.

Therefore, we are not alone, God is constantly working to sanctify and redeem our world, and we can still open ourselves up to him, just as the saints did. And just as they let God transform their hearts and lives, so we can do the same. If we give ourselves to God, he will never stop pouring his graces into us.


Registrations now open Diocesan Retreat Opportunities


Catholic Charismatic Renewal NSW & Emmaus Prayer Community Pentecost Celebrations: 8 June
