Reflections for this week's readings

First Reading: Jeremiah 38: 4-6, 8-10
Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 39: 2-4, 18
Second Reading: Hebrews 12: 1-4
Gospel: Luke 12: 49-53

The fire of the Spirit

Today's Gospel shows Jesus in anguish at the thought of the passion and crucifixion that awaits him soon. That is why this Sunday's Gospel seems to go from topic to topic.

Jesus begins by telling us that he has come to bring fire and he strongly wishes that this fire my burn. Fire may be destructive as we, in Australia, very well know. But it can also be the source of light and warmth. The fire that Jesus refers to here, is the fire of the of the Spirit which burns brightly and warmly with love within those who believe in Jesus. It is also the fire of the love of Jesus on the cross. This is the fire that Jesus so strongly yearns for.

Next Jesus tells us that he must undergo a baptism, and that baptism causes him anguish. The baptism is the baptism in his blood on the cross. Jesus experiences anguish at the thought of this baptism, just as any of us would suffer anguish if we were told that we have a terminal disease. Jesus, however, accepts his anguish and that fearful baptism since he says he must complete it.

Jesus then tells us that he had come not to bring peace but rather division. This is surprising at first since he told his disciples "Peace be with you, my peace I give you". But the division that Jesus causes is not of his doing but the result of people disagreeing over his person and his teachings. People who give priority to other loves than the love of God the Father.

Then, Jesus berates his listeners for being able to foretell the weather but were unable to recognize in him the Messiah awaited and foretold for many centuries.

Finally, Jesus says that we should seek harmony rather than justice, because we are all sinners and deserving of going to prison. This applies to the relationships among human beings, but it applies especially to our relationship with God. With God we have no coin to pay our debt with him.

So, Jesus is asking us to kindle the fire of love in our hearts along with him, and to reach to others to spread that fire of love which comes from the Spirit. Jesus also asks us to live in harmony with others rather than to seek justice since all of us are sinners and cannot claim to be just. Jesus often told us that must no judge anyone, not even ourselves. As St. Paul puts it, "Neither do I judge myself... my judge is the Lord".

Liturgy Corner

Who is the Liturgy of the Word for Children for?

The Liturgy of the Word for Children is an opportunity for children to gather together during Mass to celebrate the Liturgy of the Word, adapted to meet their needs and level of understanding. It seeks to encourage the children's full, conscious and active participation in the Mass and complement parents' efforts to raise their children in the practice of the faith.

In 1973, the Church's then Congregation for Divine Worship issued the *Directory for Masses with Children*. While much of this document focused on celebrating Masses in contexts such as primary schools, it also offers guidance for celebrating Masses with adults where children are also present (such as Sunday Mass). It is here that what we know as the Liturgy of the Word for Children was first proposed.

The adaptations that are made are focused on helping children understand the Scripture readings. For this reason, participation is open to children of primary school age. Toddlers and preschoolers are yet to be developmentally ready to engage in the readings at this level. As such, they are best supported at Mass by their parents' encouragement to focus on the actions, simple responses and symbols of the Mass. Similarly, celebrating the Liturgy of the Word with the rest of the assembly will better support older children and teenagers.


