

## Reflections for this week's readings

First Reading: Numbers 21: 4-9
Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 77: 1-2, 34-38
Second Reading: Philippians 2: 6-11
Gospel: John 3: 13-17

#### **God's Love**

While I was in Uni, I accompanied a friend of mine to an eye hospital to remove a foreign particle. This was way before all the technology we have now. The nurse had to inject him in his eye with his eye open. When he told me this outside the ward, I froze, thinking of the pain and the fear that accompanies the pain. He added that the nurse kept telling him, "Just trust me, I will make it as easy as possible for you". I asked if she could not do it with just tablets, and he responded that the medical advice was to undergo this little pain or else lose his eye. His cure was not cheap.

There were no words of comfort I could offer him as we walked out of the hospital, but I recollected a childhood story I had read about how the three Fatima seers sacrificed and offered all the pain for sinners.

In the first reading, God instructs Moses to make a serpent of brass. There is nothing in looking at a brass serpent that will cure snake bites; it was a test of their faith: "Would the Israelites obey God?" and all who looked were healed. God was preparing man for the costly price of salvation through pain and suffering

The second reading talks about the obedience of Christ to His Heavenly Father, taking the form of a servant to the point of death on a cross.

In the Gospel, Christ comes along and says that He will be lifted up like the serpent in the Old Testament. One of the few instances where the same word is applied to evil and to good. Another is the lion (the antichrist) and the Lion of Judah.

Just as the brass serpent resembled the serpent that bit the Israelites but had no poison, so our Lord on the cross, whose appearance was marred and disfigured beyond any human being, would look as if he was full of the poison of human guilt but had no sin in Him.

Salvation does not come cheap; the lesson is that unless there is a cross in our lives, there will never be a resurrection. We, too, must take up our crosses and follow Christ. But we are not alone. Just as that nurse promised my friend, "Just trust me, I will make it as easy as possible for you". The Lord promises to be with us as we walk with our crosses. We can look to him to gain courage, healing from our inequities and eternal life.

#### The Liturgy of the Word for Children

Our parish celebrate the Liturgy of the Word for Children at 10:00 am Mass. It allows children to gather and celebrate in a way that is adapted to meet their needs and level of understanding. It seeks to encourage the children's full, conscious and active participation in the Mass and complement parents' efforts to raise their children in the practice of the faith.

The priest will invite **all** children who want to participate in the Liturgy of the Word for Children to come forward. Once they are gathered, the priest will dismiss the children and leaders, who will process to the "Red Room" for their celebration.

The Liturgy of the Word for Children will then be celebrated as the rest of the assembly celebrates the Liturgy of the Word as usual. As the assembly is engaged in the Prayer of the Faithful, the children, having completed their celebration, will prepare to make their way back into the church.

As the second collection and Offertory take place, the children will return to their families as we celebrate the Liturgy of the Eucharist together.


#### Jubilee Year of Hope Reflection Day at Mary MacKillop Place
