

The Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed (All Souls Day), Yr C/1



Reflections for this week's readings

First Reading: Responsorial Psalm: Second Reading: 2 Maccabees 12: 42-45 Psalm 62: 2-6, 8-9 Philippians 3: 20-21

Gospel: Luke 7: 11-17

November always begins with the feasts of All Saints and All Souls and is a month wholly dedicated to the memory of those who have died. The readings for today remind us of where our life's journey is leading, and our need to remember those who have gone before us. The Gospel story gives us an example of Jesus' compassion for those who are in pain. He sees the suffering mother, feels her pain and restores her only son to her. The crowd is filled with awe and joy, recognising the presence of God amongst them. We all understand the mother's pain; and we can rejoice with the mother when something wonderful happens for her, as she too feels hope in the presence of God.

Isaiah gives us a beautiful image of God's promise of salvation for all. He speaks of God preparing a wonderful and joyous eternal banquet for everyone on earth, where He has removed all sadness and shame. Isaiah rejoices in our hope in the Lord and the promise of salvation for all. These are comforting words, especially when we are remembering and praying for our loved ones. The Psalm continues these thoughts. The writer describes God as our light, our strength, guiding and supporting us on our journey to the "land of the living" where we will see the goodness of God. St Paul also describes God as pouring love into our hearts so that we are filled with a joyful trust in the promise of God for reconciliation and salvation.

Today is All Souls Day when we remember not just all our loved ones, all those who have died with no special feast day, those souls who are still in Purgatory, but all people who have died. As Catholics we believe that our prayers will assist those souls still in Purgatory to be able to enter the joy of Heaven; that we are united with all those who have died. This lovely feast day has its origins in the Old Testament traditions of praying for the dead and owes its place in the modern calendar to St Odilo (998 - 1030) who commanded all Cluniac monasteries to follow this tradition and pray especially for all those who have died, on November 2nd each year. Some people may visit the graves of loved ones on this special day if they can, or others might enter a deceased person's name in the Memorial Book or attend the blessing of the plaques in our parish memorial garden. Or we might simply remember and pray quietly for the souls of all the departed.

Mandatory Safeguarding Training

As outlined in recent weeks, it is essential that all ministers have current Safeguarding training. The requirements may vary according to your circumstances, and there can be different options for ensuring you fulfil these requirements.

If You Have Never Completed Diocesan Safeguarding Training: Either attend the face-to-face workshop in our parish on Saturday 15 November, or Complete Modules 1, 2 and 3 online.

If You Work for Catholic Schools Parramatta Diocese: Your annual Safeguarding Mandatory Training covers Modules 1 and 2 - send your certificates to the Parish Office. You can then complete Module 3 online.

If You Completed Diocesan Safeguarding Training at least two years ago: Complete Modules 4 and 5 online or check our bulletin regularly for notices about Modules 4 and 5 training around the Diocese. We will try to organise a faceto-face workshop for early next year.

If you have completed Safeguarding Training not provided by the Diocese of Parramatta within the past twelve months: You may be able to seek recognition of this training towards non-compulsory modules only - visit the site listed below for more information.

To register for the workshop on 15 November, complete online modules, or find out more about Safeguarding Training requirements, visit https://parracatholic.org/safeguarding/training/

From 1 January 2026, only parishioners who have current safeguarding training in place will be included in the rosters for each liturgical ministry and be able to serve in ministerial roles. Parishioners' ability to participate in ministries will be verified against a mandatory training register. If you think you may wish to help out in the parish in some way in the future, we recommend

completing the training so that you can volunteer without delay.

We understand that this training requires the giving of your time, but hope you also share our desire to ensure that we do everything we can to ensure that young and vulnerable people are safe in our parish. Thank you for your support and cooperation.
