

Third Sunday of Advent, Yr A/2.



Reflections for this week's readings

First Reading: Isaiah 35: 1-6, 10
Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 145: 6-10,
Second Reading: James 5: 7-10
Gospel: Matthew 11: 2-11

Be strong, do not fear.

On the third Sunday, we light the pink candle of joy, yet the world feels heavy—earthquakes in Japan, floods in Asia, fires in Hong Kong. Innocent lives are lost, justice is scarce, and many struggle with rising living costs. Depression claims lives, while domestic violence, stabbings, shootings, crime, and accidents continue to grow. We ask: Can we help? Will it bring peace? Can any nation end a war? We might feel dejected and depressed. At times, the weight of it all makes me switch off the news in search of something lighter.

As a child, David's life was filled with hardship. He recalls, "I prayed and prayed, yet nothing seemed to change. Hello, Jesus—I'm pounding on heaven's door for help. Can you hear me? Will you help? All I felt was silence, with only the faintest ray of hope." Yet now he's convinced that God was walking with his family through every painful moment.

Today's scripture readings give us hope. Asks us to be patient. To trust and wait.

In the first reading, the prophet Isaiah predicts Jesus' coming. The blind will see, the deaf hear, the lame walk and the dumb speak. God promises everlasting joy to us.

The second reading gives us the image of a patient farmer waiting for his crops to grow. It recalls Job, the suffering servant. While Job saw only pain, God was at work in ways Job could not yet see—defeating the powers of evil, revealing faithfulness, and preparing restoration. Job's endurance was not wasted; in the end, he was rewarded, and God prevailed over suffering and evil.

The Gospel shows a similar struggle. John the Baptist, who had proclaimed Jesus as the Lamb of God and witnessed the Holy Spirit descend on Jesus, began to doubt while imprisoned. Facing suffering, he asked whether Jesus was truly the Messiah. Jesus did not answer directly but told John's disciples to report what they had seen—the blind healed, the lame walking, the good news proclaimed. After John's disciples left, Jesus praised John's greatness. If only John had heard those words—imagine the comfort they would have brought him in prison. Was it Jesus's poor timing, or part of a divine mystery?

Strengthen your hearts and don't grumble while we wait. Endure things around you. **God is around, watching over us.** Surrender it to Jesus -what matters in our suffering is for the good Lord to win the battle. *Michelle and David Rodrigues (Parishioners))*



Third Sunday of Advent, Yr A/2. Advent is Half Over!

Today is the third Sunday of Advent. That means that half the wait is over!

If you have an advent wreath, this is the week to light the pink candle. Pink is a symbol the joy we



have because we're halfway to Christmas.

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells the people that John the Baptist was a prophet and messenger. A prophet is someone who tells the truth. In the Old Testament the prophets told God's people the truth about God. Saint John was a prophet because he told the people that the Messiah, or saviour, was coming soon, and that they needed to repent of their sins.

Saint John the Baptist prepared the way for Jesus by calling people to repentance. You can help prepare for Christmas by thinking and talking about how Jesus came to earth on the first Christmas. Can you tell somebody the story of the first Christmas today?
