

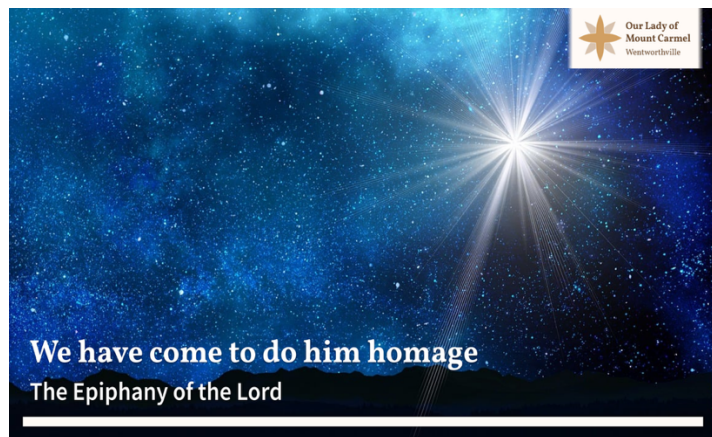

The Epiphany of the Lord



Reflections for this week's readings

First Reading: Isaiah 60: 1-6
Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 71: 1-2, 7-8, 10-13
Second Reading: Ephesians 3: 2-3, 5-6
Gospel: Matthew 2: 1-12

The appearance of the Magi is foreshadowed in the first reading (Isaiah 60:1-6) as similar gifts of gold and frankincense are mentioned in both passages. This parallel shows the change that Jesus' birth brings: the start of the strengthening of God's people.

However, He no longer sees only the people of Israel as His own; now He **includes believers from every race and nation**. St Paul, in the 2nd Reading, encourages the Jews to unite with the gentiles to embrace their new identity as Christians.

It is important to remember that the Magi were not Jews. They came from the east to pay homage to Jesus, not as a Saviour, but as a King. Yet, the Father still led them to Jesus through the star. ***Our King does not discriminate between those who are of the faith, and those who have yet to know Him.***

This mission of revealing Jesus Christ to all the world now falls onto us. The Catholic Church is missionary by nature. As members of the Church, we must be missionary disciples in our own unique ways. Our **actions** must show God our Father at work in us: Are we patient when facing difficult co-workers or family members? Do we carry out acts of mercy to those in need? Can we outdo one another in showing love (Romans 12:10)? In our lives, we will meet

those who do not know God our Father. Our actions will reveal Christ to them.

Finally, as St Paul says in the second reading, we must remember that those without our faith are still co-heirs to God's inheritance. They are no less deserving of His transformative love. Let us, then, in ways both big and small, help all come to know this love and enable them to embrace their identity as children of God, our Father.

In your previous celebrations of Christmas, how have you shown non-Christians that they are not outside His salvation?

How would you like to change the way you celebrate Christmas and bring across the message that salvation is for all?

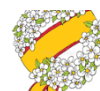

The Epiphany of the Lord

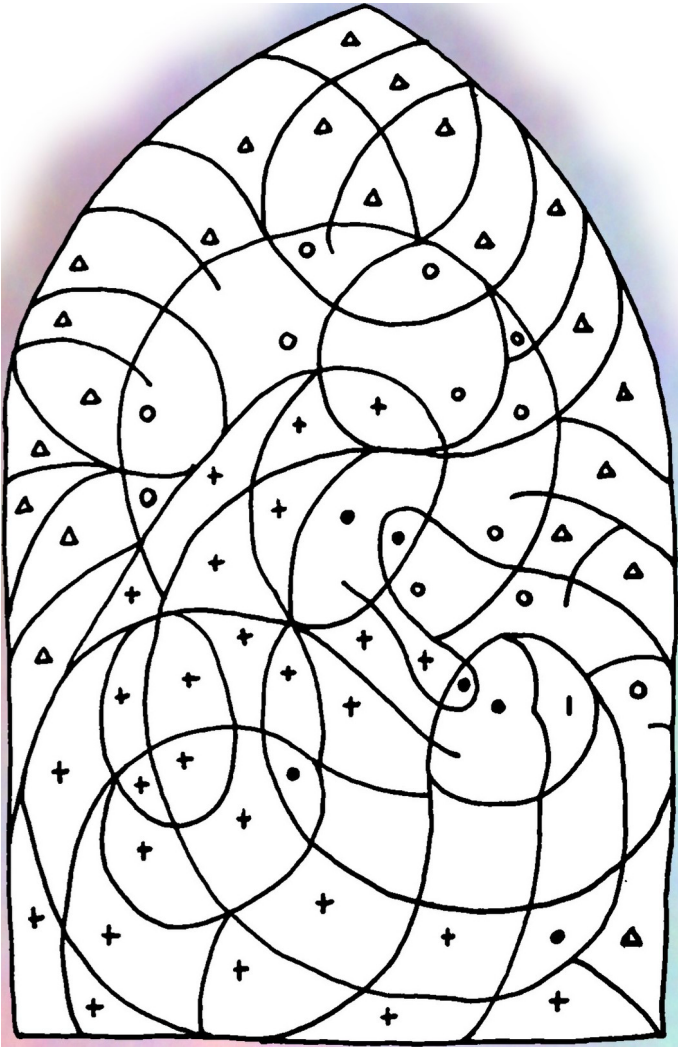
At the beginning of the new year, we celebrate both Mary, the Mother of God and the Epiphany, which is when the wise men came from far away to worship baby Jesus.
