Reflections for this week's readings

First Reading: Ecclesiasticus 15:15-20
Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 118:1-2,4-5, 17-18, 33-34
Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 2:6-10
Gospel: Matthew 5:17-37

Today's Scriptures place before us a beautiful and demanding truth: God gives us real freedom, and He calls us to use that freedom for love.

Ecclesiasticus reminds us that God has set before us fire and water, life and death. We are not puppets. The Lord trusts us with choice. His commandments are not traps but pathways to life. He never commands the impossible; rather, He gives grace so that obedience becomes a living relationship, not mere rule-keeping.

Psalm 119 responds with the heart of a disciple: "*Blessed are they who walk in the law of the Lord.*" The psalmist does not see God's law as a burden but as a joy and a guide. This is the posture we are invited to cultivate — not reluctant compliance, but a desire: "*Teach me, O Lord... give me understanding.*" The one who asks to be taught is already walking toward holiness.

Saint Paul then lifts our eyes higher. The wisdom of God is not obvious to the world; it is revealed through the Spirit. What God prepares for those who love Him surpasses what we can imagine. Christian morality, then, is not simply about behaviour — it is about entering the mystery of God's own life. We do not follow Christ only with effort; we follow Him through grace that enlightens the heart. In the Gospel, Jesus brings everything to fulfillment. He does not abolish the law; He deepens it. He moves us from

external action to interior transformation. It is not enough to avoid killing — we must uproot anger. Not enough to avoid adultery — we must purify the heart. Not enough to speak truth occasionally — our very word must become trustworthy.

Christ is teaching us that holiness begins within. The Kingdom of God grows in hidden places: intentions, desires, thoughts, and choices made when no one sees. True righteousness is not performance but communion — a heart aligned with the Father's love.

Liturgy Corner

How is it that the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke have so much in common?

While there is an obvious degree of commonality between the Gospels we hear in Ordinary Time each year, each also has its own unique characteristics that offer us a deeper insight into the person of Jesus and his teaching.

You may have heard the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke referred to as "synoptic" gospels, reflecting the high degree of commonality between them. This "collective" or "single view" of Jesus' life is evident in the large amount of content that is similar across two (eg the Sermon on the Mount/Sermon on the Plain), or sometimes all three Gospels (eg the Proclamation of John the Baptist).

But was this commonality simply coincidental? After all, each Gospel recounts the same life of Jesus? Biblical scholars have come to find over time that the similarities between the synoptic gospels are a result of two factors. First, it's believed that the Matthean and Lukan communities had access to the Gospel of Mark as their own Gospels developed. Second, it's also believed that each community possessed a (now lost) single written

collection of Jesus' sayings that was used as material across the three gospels.

Financial Report for the Six Months Period 1 July 2025 to 31 December 2025

A satisfactory result of a surplus of \$43,834 was achieved for the period under review. This was basically achieved as a result of having the position of Secretary vacant for the whole period of 6 months.

Revenue for the six months amounted to a total of \$102,778 represented by planned giving of \$88,724 and other revenue of \$14,054. Planned Giving was \$2,856 (3.3%) above budget. Other revenue was mainly made up of proceeds from raffles \$8,978 and donations of \$1,373. Expenses amounted to \$58,944 and were below the budgeted figure of \$90,197, representing a savings of \$31,253 (34.6%). These were incurred on wages and employee related expenses of \$22,148, administration \$12,803, Interest on Loan \$8,062, repairs and maintenance \$9,428, power, water and rates \$3,462, liturgical \$1,734 and motor vehicle running \$4,386. The Parish held a cash balance of \$97,328 as at 31 December 2025. Insurance premiums are due by 31 March 2026. These are expected to amount to around \$35,000, thus reducing the cash balance to \$62,000. The Parish loan stood at \$323,362, a reduction of \$5,899 since the start of the current financial year.

The Finance Committee is currently obtaining quotes for the supply and installation of a new AV system consisting of two large TV screens facing the congregation and a smaller one facing the altar. It is hoped that these will be installed by the end of June. Three office computers require replacement.

Our quota for The Catholic Foundation for 2025/2026 is \$14,400. In addition, there is an unpaid balance brought forward from the previous year of \$17,458 making a total payable of \$31,858. Prior to Covid, the Parish (like other parishes) used to have four special collections throughout the year, to cover these contributions (previously known as the DWF). Now this has been reduced to two a year. Contributions to The Catholic Foundation are tax deductible. Over the last five years contributions towards this cause have dropped to a dribble. We encourage

parishioners to be generous and help us meet this quota payment. Each parish contributes 10% of their revenue to the Diocese.

We would like to thank all parishioners for their continued financial support as without it, the Parish will not be able to provide the spiritual services it currently does.

When should I complete my Safeguarding Training?

All Clergy, employees and volunteers in parish ministry are required by the NSW Children's Guardian Act 2019 to be current and complete with Safeguarding Training.

- If you are new to ministry, you must complete the Introductory Modules 1-3 (Cycle 1).
- If you completed Cycle 1 modules two years ago, you must complete Renewal Modules 4 and 5 (Cycle 2)
- If you renewed your Cycle 2 two years ago, you must complete a Refresher Module 6 (Cycle 3)
